- 3) **Develop** additional materials for outreach
 - a) A Post Card or Invitation
 - b) Visitor Follow-up thank you card / letter/ event list
 - c) Possible questionnaire to solicit ideas, and solicit opinions....?
- 4) "Physical" Outreach:
 - a) New arrivals to Williamstown: List available? (for mailing.)
- 5) **Signage**: Review design and information value of exterior and interior signage

If we follow this blueprint, whether modified, added to, or pared down somewhat, with the idea in mind that we being God's hands and working towards His purpose, perhaps we can begin to build our membership and enhance our image in the community.
