# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE ANNUAL CONGREGATION MEETING AND COUNCIL RETREAT

The annual congregation meeting was held on Sunday January 26th.

Printed copies of the 2019 Annual Report to the congregation were distributed, and committee heads read reports and answered any questions that arose.

The congregation voted on and approved a plan to have the entire parking lot resurfaced this spring. The funds will primarily come from earnings on the investment account, with additional amounts coming from donations to the parking lot fund and the property improvement account. The resurfacing will be scheduled for this spring.

The congregation also approved updating the St. John's constitution to conform to the 2019 model constitution provided by the synod. Once the updates are done, the new constitution will be sent to the synod for approval. None of the changes in the update are significant or have an impact on the way the church operates or its mission.

The congregation approved new council member Pat Brownawell to fill the opening left by Lois Gibbs term ending.

The council met on February 8 for their annual retreat meeting to elect officers and plan for the coming year. Officers elected were Obie O'Brien, President; Rich Oberle, Vice President; Henry Fickenscher, Treasurer; and Pat Brownawell, Secretary.



# **EVANGELISM**

devolved over the years; but it isn't totally unused!



"Who goes there?"... It's a common (but older) expression... sort of like a greeting, with a sense of caution. Most often, this isn't used in that same way anymore, as language has evolved... or as some may opine,

I suggest, when people drive by a church that looks like it's been there a long time, and yet the viewer has never been in it - or perhaps has not been in any church . . . for long time, they may wonder, "Who goes there?" One wonders, does anyone I know go there . . . and/or do many people ever go there anymore?

In our case, we know that we go here, to St. John's, for spiritual renewal, support, and instruction, and for fellowship and Divine worship, among others who believe as we do. The passer-by doesn't see us, hear us, or in most cases, know any of us . . . but also in many cases, they DO know one or more of us, but have ever "thought of us in this way."

Putting our Evangelism hats on, let us contemplate this. How can we let others that we know, or have known but maybe have lost touch with, that we are still faithful, and that we still attend this awesome church, and worship our Awesome God here?

Perhaps "technology"... often perceived as a double-edged sword - can be of assistance! A great suggestion was given to me by one of our members after the Annual Meeting last month. It's been suggested that those of us who use social media such as Facebook take advantage of the "check in" feature when arriving here.

This would allow any friends or followers to recognize that you deem St. John's to be a worthy place to go - and as time goes by. . . that you report in from here often (or regularly, perhaps.) Most of us use a "smartphone" and turn off our sounds when we come inside. . . . a quick extra second or two for "checking in" might be a good way to "Evangelize!"

I would suggest "not necessarily" photographing and tagging others all the time, because we all get a lot of comments when that happens - but from time to time, it lends credibility to your post! (And we can all handle a few extra "Likes"...)

It's just one thing . . . but it could be one big thing . . . to get our church's name "out there," and help build the good will that could help to build our congregation!
